American Legion National Preparedness Month





National Preparedness Month is an observance each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.

The American Legion's **National Emergency Fund Preparation Guide** helps posts prepare for a natural disaster and apply for a National Emergency Fund grant.

Grants from the National Emergency Fund are available — up to \$3,000 to Legionnaires and SAL members displaced due to damages to their primary residence from declared natural disasters, and up to \$10,000 for Legion posts that have been damaged by a natural disaster and whose programs and activities within the community have been impacted.

The Legion is also joined with the Department of Homeland Security in promotion of disaster preparedness and response. Both organization what Americans to take simple steps to prepare. Being ready for a catastrophe before it happens may help you protect yourself, your family and your home.

Having an emergency preparedness kit on hand may help you keep your family safe during a disaster. Store supplies in a large waterproof container near a door or in your garage so you can grab it and find shelter quickly. Read.gov recommends you have at least three days worth of food, water, and medications on hand. Your disaster kit should include: Drinking water (one gallon per person a day), Nonperishable food, Manual Can opener, Flashlight, Radio, and Sanitation Supplies.

National Suicide Prevention Month



September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, when mental health advocates, prevention organizations, survivors, allies, and community members come together to raise awareness about the stigmas associated with suicide, provide mental health resources and share the message that suicide is preventable.

That is the mission behind The American Legion's <u>Be the One</u> initiative: to destigmatize asking for mental health support, provide peer-to-peer support and resources, and educate everyone on how they can Be the One.

Today, the No. 1 issue facing those who served is veteran suicide, according to the <u>National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report</u>. Each day, no fewer than 17 veterans die by suicide. That's more than 6,000 each year. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults. As the Global War on Terrorism continues, there will be more veterans facing mental-health issues such as post-traumatic stress disorder.

Veterans, service members and their loves ones can connect in confidence with VA responders 24 hours a day, seven days a week by contacting the <u>VA's Crisis Line</u> in the following three ways: Call toll-free at (800) 273-8255 and then press 1, Text the number 838255, and Chat online at <u>www.veteranscrisisline.net/chat</u> To show your support to a veteran or service member who may be at risk, help spread the message about suicide prevention awareness on social media by using VA's hashtag #BeThere.

COMMANDERS POST MESSAGE



Hello Post 586

We are hoping that September will put the end to the major heat dome that has been parked over our state for the last few weeks. However we can be sure that September is going to bring V-J Day, Patriot Day, POW/MIA Day, Hispanic Heritage Month, American Legion Day, Air Force Birthday, and Gold Star Mother's Day.

September 2, 1945 on the teak decks of the USS Missouri in the Tokyo Bay, representatives of the Emperor of Japan signed the Instrument of Surrender. The document was also signed by Gen. Douglas MacArther and approved by President Truman. This day was identified as VJ DAY or Victory Over Japan Day, and the end of WWII.

September 11th has been designated as Patriot Day. This day is for us to commemorate the lives of those who died in the 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City, the Pentagon in Virginia and those who perished when the hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Pennsylvania. Please participate in moment of silence beginning at 7:46AM CST.

September 15th is National POW/MIA Recognition Day, held each year on the third Friday of September. This commemoration is set aside to honor the commitment and sacrifices made by the nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action, as well as their families.

What is Hispanic Heritage Month? Every year, America celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15, honoring the contributions and sacrifices Hispanic and Latino Americans have made to the nation, it's culture, and industry. What started off as a humble seven day observation in the late 1960s turned into a month-long celebration of a rich diversity of cultures.

On September 16, 1919 the American Legion received a federal charter from Congress for its continued aid to wounded warriors and military families, legacy of community volunteerism and significant role in establishing important national legislation. In 2009 Congress passed a resolution designating September 16 as being "American Legion Day".

The official Air Force Birthday is recognized as September 18, 1947 the day of the passage of the National Security Act of 1947. That legislation created what would later be known as the United States Department of Defense. This established the United States Air Force as a separate branch of military service. Before the creation of the Air Force, the military's flying operation were handled by the U.S. Army on land and the Navy by sea.

Gold Star Mother's Day is observed on the last Sunday in September which will be Sunday, Sept. 24, 2023. Gold Star Mother's Day is intended to recognize and honor those mothers who have lost a son or daughter in the service of the U.S. Armed Forces.

As we hope that one of the hottest Texas summers are coming to a end. We are thankful for our Military service members and Veterans. From the V-J Day Veterans, the 9/11 Veterans, Our POW/MIA Veterans, and the Gold Star Mother Veterans. They all should be remembered this month. Let's say a prayer for them, and never forget.
