Post 586 and Post 586 Houston Honor Guard Donate to Camp Hope



Camp Hope Houston PTSD Foundation of America provides interim housing for veterans and their families suffering from combat related Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) in a caring and positive environment. The facility opened in 2021 and is located in a quiet and safe setting in Houston, Texas whereby veterans and their immediate family members can find healing, help and hope while benefiting from and intensive peer support and mentoring programs for PTSD. In addition to temporary housing at no cost to the veteran. Camp Hope offers a four to six month PTSD recovery program in which residents: attend group lessons and support sessions with other combat veterans: conduct individual mentoring sessions with certified combat trauma mentors; participate in off-site small group interaction activities (fishing, hiking, local activities and events); and get involved with local churches and businesses and volunteer organizations to assist in their personal healing.

This is why Post 586 and our Honor Guard decided to visit Camp Hope on September 13th. During this visit we were able to tour the facilities, and make a \$4000 donation. The donation was made because we truly believe in the mission of helping our fellow veterans, and Camp Hope Houston is leading the charge on this effort.

Meet Our Newly Elected National Commander

Daniel J. Seehafer was elected national commander of The American Legion on Aug. 31, 2023, in Charlotte, N.C., during the 104th national convention. Seehafer likes to say, "It's personal," when it comes to The American Legion's mission of serving veterans and their families. He is continuing the theme of "Be the One," to prevent veteran suicide.

An ordained minister from Wisconsin, he earned his American Legion eligibility through service in the U.S. Navy and Navy Reserve, where he served as a military chaplain. A member of American Legion Post 157 in Horicon, Wis., Seehafer served in a number of American Legion offices at every level, including national chaplain and commander of the Department of Wisconsin.

Born and raised in Merrill, Wis., he lettered in cross-country track while in high school and later received a bachelor's degree in pastoral ministry from Concordia University and a Master of Divinity at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Ind.

Seehafer was installed as assistant pastor of St. Stephen Lutheran Church in Horicon in 1997 and continues to serve as administrative pastor of the church and its school. His American Legion post was recognized for "100 percent" and "All-Time High" in membership during his terms as commander and adjutant. Other honors include District Commander's New Post Achievement Award, Silver Brigade, and Post 157 Legionnaire of the Year.

In 2023, Seehafer earned an Outstanding Heroism Award for administering the Heimlich maneuver to a choking victim at an American Legion dinner.

After retiring from the U.S. Navy, Gene was employed at Level (3) Communications in Broomfield, CO as a Program Manager of Network Migrations and Operations, Number Management, and Financial Analyst for Mergers and Acquisitions. After retiring from Level (3) Communications in 2010, Gene returned home to Greenville and has served The American Legion at the Post, District, Division and State level in numerous positions.

COMMANDERS POST MESSAGE



Hello Post 586

The fall equinox has since passed, which signals the shift between summer and fall. The equinox marks the point when daytime and nighttime are roughly equal in length. Afterwards, the sun will rise later and set earlier throughout the months following. The hours of sunlight will diminish, and signs of fall will begin. Not only does October brings the changes of the seasons, but it also has the anniversaries of Operation Enduring Freedom and the Grenada invasion and the US Navy Birthday.

In response to the September 2001 terrorist attacks on New York's World Trade Center and the Pentagon, President George W. Bush launched the Global War on Terror (GWOT). On October 7, 2001 Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) began, when the United States launched military operations in Afghanistan, including air strikes against Kabul, and Kandahar.

The United States Navy originated over 240 years ago as the Continental Navy. The then Continental congress authorized 2 armed vessels to search for ships supplying the British army with weapons and ammunition during the American Revolutionary War (1775-1783). When the war ended, the continental Navy was dismantled, but pirate threats to American merchant shipping led President George Washington to establish the Naval Act of 1794, creating a permanent standing US Navy. The official birthday of the United States Navy is October 13, 1775.

President Ronald Regan, citing the great threat posed to American nationals on the Caribbean nation of Grenada by that nation's Marxist regime, orders U.S. forces to invade and secure their safety. There were approximately 1,000 Americans in Grenada at the time, many of them students at the island's medical school. The invasion code-named Operation Urgent Fury, started on October 25, 1983, with the United States military, and a coalition of six Caribbean nations.

As we start enjoying the best season of the year. We are thankful for our Military service members and Veterans. From the Operation Enduring Freedom Veterans, the Operation Urgent Fury Veterans, and our Navy Veterans. They all should be remembered this month.
