RETURN ON INVESTMENT: American Legion Texas Boys State Success Story



In 2022, Post 586 developed a relationship with the Sam Houston MSTC JROTC program. The initial reason this Post reached out to the program was to seek out young men who would be interested in a scholarship for Texas Boys State. The Black Knights promoted four young men, one of them was the battalion commander Erik Jimenez, to attend Texas Boys State. At that time, Erik Jimenez had aspirations to be accepted into the United States Military Academy at West Point. He had no idea if he could make it, but he was willing to do anything to achieve his goal.

Post 586 sent Erik along with three other 11th grade young men to Austin, TX to represent the Northline area. In that group of four young men, two of them (Benjamin Benavides and Marco Montes) enlisted into the U.S. Navy and U.S. Army. Erik was in fact accepted into the prestigious and historic military academy and the Director of Diversity Recruitment and Enrollment, Infantry Captain Kelechi Odocha, informed Erik that by him attending Texas Boys State, this was one of the deciding factors for his selection.

In December of 2023, now West Point Cadet Erik Jimenez returned home for the holidays to visit his almamater, Sam Houston MSTC, to show his former battalion that taking risks and seeking opportunities will help you reach your goals. While in Houston, the Houston Independent School District interviewed Erik asking him about his journey. He mentioned that Texas Boys State was very beneficial to his success and he thanked Post 586 for what they have done for him.

American Legion Post 586 2nd Annual Junior Shooting Match

On January 25, 2024, Post 586 hosted the 2nd Annual Junior Shooting Match at Sam Houston MSTC. The marksmanship team from the Army JROTC program consisted of Senior Jai Nava, Sophomore Julissa Vergara, Freshmen Nayeli Davila and Jose Lazo.

There are three categories of fires in the competition which are prone, standing, and kneeling. Cadets are given 20-25 minutes to complete each set of targets using lead pellets. Commander Rumph told the cadets prior to the match there are several rounds of competition if they continue to advance after round one. He also informed the cadets that the American Legion Post 586 is considering rewarding a \$500 scholarship for college to the top marksman during this competition.

Sergeant First Class Barry Page is the head coach for the Sam Houston MSTC marksmanship team while the other two Army instructors serve as assistant coaches and mentors. The team competes in four Houston Independent School District matches per year. Last school year, the team placed 1st overall in the district, but this year is a rebuilding year after three seniors were graduated from the program.

Uncle Sam

You may not have known that Uncle Sam was a real person! In case you're unfamiliar, "Uncle Sam" is the famous patriotic character we see on the poster that reads, "I want *you* for U.S. army." Born Samuel Wilson in 1766, the real-life Uncle Sam worked as a meat packer in Troy, New York. During the War of 1812, he supplied troops with meat that he shipped in barrels. The barrels contained the branding "U.S.," short for "United States," but people often joked that it actually stood for "Uncle Sam." The trope eventually spread far and wide, and the rest is history (literally). This photo of Wilson was taken sometime in the 1850s, and is the only known photograph of him.

Hello Post 586 Legionnaires

February is the shortest month, however it has a lot to offer. There is Presidents Day, Black History Month, Four Chaplains Day, USO Birthday, and the American Legion Membership renewal deadline.

Presidents Day is a holiday on the third Monday of February to honor all persons who served as Presidents of the United States. In 1879 by an Act of Congress it was originally implemented to honor George Washington, on February 22nd. However in 1971 the holiday was moved to the third Monday in February by the Uniform Monday Holiday Act.

National Black History Month started its origins in 1915, which historian and author Dr. Carter G. Woodson founded the Association of the Study of Negro Life and History. Through this organization Dr. Woodson initiated the first Negro History Week in February 1926. He selected February because it includes the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, two key figures in the history of black Americans. In 1975, President Gerald Ford issued a message on the observance of Black History Week. In 1986, congress passed Public Law 99244, which designated February 1986 as National Black (Afro-American) History Month.

February 4th is the official birthday of the organization known as United Service Organization or USO. The USO was founded on February 4, 1941 by Mary Ingraham in response to a request from President Franklin D. Roosevelt to provide morale and recreation services to U.S. uniformed military personnel. The USO has been a fixture in military life for more than seven decades. There are over 30,000 volunteers that work with the USO at location worldwide including military bases, airports, and major metro areas.

Ceremonies and services are held each year on or around February 3rd, Four Chaplains Day, by numerous military and civilian groups and organizations. In 1998, February 3rd of that year was established by senate resolution 169-98 as Four Chaplains day to commemorate the anniversary of the sinking of the United States Army transport ship, the Dorchester, which was the second worst sea disaster of WWII. During the sinking of the ship, amongst the panic and chaos four Chaplains provided prayer and encouragement. The Four Chaplains (Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, and Methodist) gave up their own life jackets when the supply ran out.
