## American Legion Post 586 Return on Investment

College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) has become a primary purpose for education at Sam Houston MSTC and throughout the Houston Independent School District. Sam Houston earns points annually for seniors who graduate and attend college/university, enlist into the military, accepted into a military academy, or take a career position at a company based training while in high school.

The American Legion Post #586 has played a vital role in the development of young men and women at Sam Houston MSTC granting scholarships to Texas Boys and Girls State. In 2022, Post #586 sent four young men and two young women to their respective camps fully funded. The return on investment was one young man was ultimately accepted in the United States Military Academy at West Point being the first student in the history of his high school to be accepted and attend. Two others enlisted into the U.S. Army and U.S. Navy.

In 2023, Post #586 sent three young men and one young lady to their respective camps. Two of those young men enlisted into the U.S. Army and the young lady is the second student from Sam Houston to be accepted to the Military Academy at West Point.

This year, Post #586 sponsored seven young men and one young lady to attend their respective camps. One young man is set to enlist into the U.S. Marine Corps in early July. Several others have interest in enlisting. We will report back when we receive an update on what they decide to do. We should celebrate that young people are signing up for challenging curriculum sets taking opportunities to excel. And, we should also celebrate that Post #586 is helping a high school develop young people to be better citizens.

#### **COMMANDERS POST MESSAGE**



Hello Post 586

As we start July, which is the beginning of the hottest days of summer. July also has Independence Day, Hire a Veteran Day, Korean War Veterans Armistice Day, and Buffalo Soldiers day.

Independence Day, also called Fourth of July or July 4<sup>th</sup>, in the United State, which is an annual celebration. This annual celebration derived from when the 13 colonies, on July 4, 1776, claimed their independence from Great Britain, and eventually led to the formation of the United States. Also on June 28, 1870 Congress passed a law making Independence Day a Federal Holiday.

National hire a Veteran Day is observed on July 25<sup>th</sup>. This day was established to make awareness of civilian employment for transitioning service members and Veterans after their military service. In 2017 Congress passed the Honoring Investments in Recruiting and Employing American Military Veterans Act (HIRE Vets Act) to encourage employers to consider and hire Veterans.

After three years of brutal fighting on the Korean Peninsula, on July 27, 1953 the Korean War ended. During this war over 35, 000 US Service members lost their lives. A few years after the Korean War Memorial was finished, U.S. Code Title 36 was amended to recognize Korean War Veterans Armistice Day on July 27, 2001. While not a federal holiday, the law asks Americans to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities that honor and give thanks to our Korean War Veterans.

In 1866, Congress passed legislation known as the Army Organization Act, which created six all-black U.S. Cavalry and Infantry units. These troops served on the Western frontier after the Civil War. During an Indian War battle in 1867, Native American Cheyenne Warriors gave these Soldiers the nickname Buffalo Soldiers because of their features and said they fought like fierce and brave buffalo. In 1992 Congress passed a law designating July 28<sup>th</sup> as Buffalo Soldiers day.

July is the beginning of the dog days of summer, however please encourage a business owner to hire a veteran, reach out to our fellow Korean War Veterans, research the story of the Buffalo Soldiers, and celebrate the 247th Birthday of the United States of America.
